Some of the park's features includes an obstacle agility course that can be used to exercise and train pets, a shared watering station for you and your dog(s) to enjoy, and benches for you to relax on while your dog(s) plays. Andersen Park also offers a beautiful trail system. We are proud of our newest park and excited to offer this great resource to you.

History of Andersen Park

Andersen Park is a 33 acre parcel that was donated to the Town of Glenville in 2007 by Mr. Mark Andersen in memory of his wife, Sandra K. Andersen. It was originally part of a large property owned by the Hadel family in the early 1900's. For many years, the field where the dog park is located was farmed by Keith Buhrmaster. The Town completed a master plan for the parcel in 2010, which included a dog park, a leaf compost farm and a trail system. The house and barn on Swaggertown Road are part of the property, with their ultimate use still to be determined.

Rules and Regulations

- An owner may bring no more than two registered dogs to the park at any time.
- Each dog must have a collar clearly displaying NYS license and Glenville dog park tag.
- All dogs must be under control accompanied by a responsible person aged 17 or above.
- Children ages 12-16 must be accompanied by responsible person aged 17 or above.
- Children under the age of 12 are not allowed in the fenced area of the dog park.
- Dog owners must accompany and control their dog(s) at all times.
- Dog owners are solely responsible for the actions of their dogs.
- Dogs that have been declared dangerous or aggressive, or female dogs in heat are <u>NOT</u> permitted in the dog park.
- Dog owner/responsible person <u>MUST</u> clean up dog feces and dispose in proper receptacle. Littering is prohibited.
- SMOKING IS PROHIBITED IN THE DOG PARK.
- NO food or beverages permitted in dog park, with exception of bite-sized dog training treats.
- Responsible person must fill any holes dug by dog before leaving dog park.

Rules and Regulations cont'd

- Puppies under 4 months of age are not allowed.
- Large dogs greater than 30 pounds must use large dog area.
- Small dogs under 30 pounds must use small dog area
- Parking is not allowed on Van Buren or Swaggertown Roads.
- Penalties for violations of these rules are as provided in Section 195-26.

What's Next?

- A valid dog license
- A dog park permit (Renewable annually)
 - * Complete dog park application
 - * Submit proof of rabies vaccination certificate
 - * Submit proof of distemper vaccine
 - * Proof of residency
- Both are obtainable at the Glenville Town Clerk's office, Glenville Municipal Center, 18 Glenridge Road, Glenville, N.Y.

Fees

- Glenville Town residents— Free
- Non-residents: \$50.00 first two dogs; additional dogs \$25.00 each

Andersen Dog Park Features

- Fenced in area; one for large dogs and one for small dogs
- Picnic tables
- Human and canine water fountain
- Handicapped accessible
- Dog waste receptacle and dog waste bags
- Equipment for your dog's enjoyment
- Beautiful I/2 mile nature trail located at NW corner of dog park (dogs must be leashed on all town park trails at all times.)
